HEAD COACH FOR BADMINTON & PARABADMINTON YOUTH TEAM



1. ABOUT THE ORGANIZATION

The Peruvian Badminton Sports Federation is in charge of promoting and developing badminton and parabadminton at a national level through promoting sports culture that contributes to the improvement of the quality of life.

2. JOB DESCRIPTION

The Head Coach Junior & Parabadminton (HCJP) acts as the highest authority in the training of the Peruvian Badminton Peruvian Sports Federation (FDPB) youth team, directs and plans their daily training in conjunction with the Head Coach General and the Head of the Technical Unit. He is responsible for implementing strategies, plans and decisions made by the Technical Unit and/or, Technical Committee and if applicable, the Board of Directors. He/she must organize and attend all meetings of the Technical Unit, Technical Committee and Board of Directors when invited and/or summoned. The HCJP must also liaise closely with FDPB committees and commissions and all other governance related bodies within the FDPB and facilitate timely and effective decision making in accordance with the outlined objectives and vision of the FDPB. As the head of technical staff under him/her, the HCJP is responsible for directing, managing and monitoring all technical staff of the Technical Unit, under his/her charge. The HCJP must also communicate periodically with the FDPB Board Chair on strategies, coordination with member associations, annual planning. He/she shall be a member of the FDPB Technical Committee. He/she shall implement and enforce the policies, regulations and all the necessary provisions for the proper operation of the training sessions, and shall form the pairs of players in conjunction with the Technical Unit with a view to the best international results, in addition to preparing and presenting his/her training plan to the IPD methodologists, in conjunction with the Technical Unit.

4 MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES

- Comply on time and in a timely and truthful manner with the regulations that the IPD has.
- Manage compliance with taking daily assistance to athletes.
- Assess athletes systematically at each stage of preparation.
- Define the technical objectives in the international events of the annual calendar.
- Define, together with the General Head Coach, the partners of their athletes in men's doubles, women's doubles and mixed doubles.
- Define together with the General Head Coach, the team that will represent Peru in international team and individual championships.
- Coach athletes in national and international events.
- Manage a personalized report for each athlete prior to each fundamental event well in advance to prepare and develop their strengths and reduce their weaknesses, with a view to obtaining good results in said events.
- Evaluate, Supervise and direct all personnel under their charge.
- Propose promotions, increases of the personnel in charge.
- Apply the work plan and the decisions entrusted by the General Head Coach.
- Comply with the schedules entrusted by the Technical Unit, demonstrating punctuality and commitment in each of the training sessions.
- Submit in a timely manner (last day of the month) their monthly work reports and the PAD reports of the athletes under their charge.


5. SELECTION CRITERIA

- At least 10 years of experience in coaching national teams or Clubs with proven results at national or international level.
- University degree in a career related to the sport (not essential).
- Courses endorsed by the BWF Level 1, 2 and 3 preferably.
- Preference will be given to former national team players of their country. (not essential)
